We entered some of the young people's artwork from our Summer Programme into a project funded by Co-op Foundation.

The project is called 'Your New Normal, My Normal' and is part of the 'Common Ground' project which aims to tackle loneliness and break down barriers between young disabled people and their non-disabled peers.

All work submitted to the project was judged by a panel of experts and we are very pleased to report that 4 pieces created in our sessions were selected for the online gallery exhibition at Wolverhampton Art Gallery.

We think exhibitions are a great way to celebrate the successes of people and go some way to building confidence in skills knowing that there is an audience for their work.
