Over the summer we worked with Deaf Action in Scotland on a programme of evening online arts activities for their youth club. We delivered 12 sessions of varied and interactive projects including: Anime art; mood boards; drawing; painting; and 5 Ways to Wellbeing poster designs. We provided all the materials and resources which were sent in packages to families and then we led the sessions online.
